Miyake style originates from Miyake-jima, an island south of Tokyo. It is played primarily on miya-daikos (temple drums) and is played horizontally. Its raw power and relatively simplistic patterns will get everyone, players and audience alike, involved and captivated by the piece. Miyake is said to take a few hours to pick up, but a lifetime to master.

Pete was fortunate to be able to learn several times a year with Tsumura Sensei and his three sons. The Tsumura family are the grand masters of Miyake taiko in Japan and have taught several groups. Pete studied taiko between 3 to 5 times a week over 4 years while in Japan.
